

PARTICIPANTS NEEDED FOR RESEARCH in a study to co-develop a research agenda for examining the impact of pharmacist-led medication reviews in interdisciplinary primary-care memory clinics.

This study aims to co-develop a research agenda for examining the impact of pharmacist-led medication reviews in interdisciplinary primary-care based memory clinics, on the quality of medication use and health outcomes in persons with dementia and its impact on care partners.

We are inviting:

- Persons who are taking at least one medication daily, and who can self-report their diagnosis of dementia or cognitive impairment.
- Care partners (e.g., family member, friend, or neighbor) who are directly involved the medication management of a person diagnosed with dementia or cognitive impairment on a daily basis.
- Healthcare clinicians, including physicians, pharmacists, or community support workers, who are licensed to practice in Canada.

As a participant in this study, you will be asked to join two virtual information sessions (1.5 hours duration) and one planning meeting (6 hours duration).
